



## R'A'F FAR'EAST'FLIGHT

The RAF Far East Flight's pioneering cruise from the UK to Australia and South-east Asia via the Middle and Far East using four Supermarine Southampton Ils covered some 27,000 miles (43,450km) and was hailed as a major achievement for the Service. In celebration, a souvenir pack was made available shortly afterwards, from which the hand-coloured maps and crew photographs are reproduced here exactly as they were in the original pack.


